

About the Fund

The Pen Bryn Oer Wind Farm is committed to providing a community benefit fund of £30,000 per year for community projects.

The Fund allows groups to apply for grants between £250 and £2,000. However, applications up to £7,500 will be considered for exceptional projects that can demonstrate a significant and wide community benefit to both areas of Rhymney and Tredegar.

There are two application rounds each year. The next closing dates are:

9 March 2022 (decisions will be made by the end of May)
31 August 2022 (decisions will be made by mid November)

Project Locations

Projects for which grants are requested must be located within the Community Council areas of Rhymney and Tredegar. Each donation will be split equally between the community council areas of Rhymney and Tredegar (e.g. £30,000 equates to £15,000 for each community).

Project Purpose

The Fund is open to **any** community project which is for the benefit of residents of the local area. This Fund can provide both capital and revenue grants.

Eligible Organisations

Eligible Organisations, who can apply for funding include:

- ♦ Voluntary and community groups, local charities
- ♦ Community and Town Councils
- ♦ Schools and educational establishments (for projects above LEA responsibility)
- ♦ Social enterprises (including credit unions, co-operatives, social firms, community owned enterprises, community interest companies and development trusts) provided they operate on a not-for-profit basis.

Applicants are required to have a written constitution, a set of rules, or a governing document and a bank or building society account, held in the name of the organisation, in place before applying for a grant.
